

# ANTI-DISPLACEMENT COMMUNITY CONVERSATION GUIDE

The Anti-Displacement Project Group is developing a guide for residents to start conversations with their neighbors about how to create the neighborhood they want without displacement and how to organize themselves to determine the future of their neighborhood.

Anti-displacement tools can come in the form of public education campaigns, community organizing, and established relationships within city government.

The goal is to ensure that residents have tools to engage with one another when faced with potential threat of displacement.

This Group (formerly the Anti-Displacement Working Group) began meeting in 2018 with a focus on anti-displacement measures in response to the displacement of households in the St. Louis Place neighborhood following the announcement of the new campus for the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA West). Past successes include the start of the Real Estate Tax Assistant Fund (RETAF).

- Research best practices for community engagement around anti-displacement conversations.
- Develop framework for the “Guide to Having Conversations About Displacement and Neighborhood Development”.
- Attend neighborhood and community meetings to distribute the “Guide”.
